The Bible Reveals A Living Christ Luke 24:1-9

At the crack of dawn on Sunday, the women came to the tomb carrying the burial spices they had prepared. [2] They found the entrance stone rolled back from the tomb, [3] so they walked in. But once inside, they couldn't find the body of the Master Jesus. [4] They were puzzled, wondering what to make of this. Then, out of nowhere it seemed, two men, light cascading over them, stood there. [5] The women were awestruck and bowed down in worship. The men said, "Why are you looking for the Living One in a cemetery? [6] He is not here, but raised up. Remember how he told you when you were still back in Galilee [7] that he had to be handed over to sinners, be killed on a cross, and in three days rise up?" [8] Then they remembered Jesus' words. [9] They left the tomb and broke the news of all this to the Eleven and the rest.

Part 2: The Validity of Scripture

The Bible is God's revelation of Himself to man that is inspired by the Holy Spirit, accurate in every word, inerrant in content, canonized in 66 books and preserved as God's Word relevant for everyone of every generation. It is God's revelation of Himself to you today.

The difference between the Bible and some of the later literature that some folks are trying to use to discredit the Bible is that the Bible is God's Word given to men through the inspiration of Holy Spirit and not just man's opinion. In this study you will learn reasons why it obviously has a source other than that of the sinful heart of man.

2 Peter 1:20-21 (Msg) "The main thing to keep in mind here is that no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of private opinion. [21] And why? Because it's not something concocted in the human heart. Prophecy resulted when the Holy Spirit prompted men and women to speak God's Word."

Men without a right relationship with God rebel against the truth of God's Word that exposes their sinful rebellious heart and ways. They do not want to shape up and get life together according to God's Truth so they feel compelled to discredit it and deny that it is the ultimate truth by which man can do life from God's perspective.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (Msg) "Every part of Scripture is God-breathed and useful one way or another—showing us truth, exposing our rebellion, correcting our mistakes, training us to live God's way. [17] Through the Word we are put together and shaped up for the tasks God has for us."

Monday:

Authority of The Bible 2 Peter 1:16-21(NIV)

We did not follow cleverly invented stories when we told you about the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. [17] For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." [18] We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain. [19] And we have the word of the prophets made more certain, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. [20] Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. [21] For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

Deception. 2 Timothy 3:6-7 (Msg)

These are the kind of people who smooth-talk themselves into the homes of unstable and needy women and take advantage of them, women who, depressed by their sinfulness, take up with every new religious fad that calls itself "truth." [7] They get exploited every time and never really learn. (Jude 1:4)
